

Homeschool Partnership Program (HSP)

Courtney Christian School seeks to connect Christian homeschool families with the opportunity to learn in a Christian environment throughout students' high school years. HSP students can enroll in a maximum of three classes on our campus. Classes at CCS will only be offered to HSP students if a seat is available. If a class is available, the HSP student can enroll in one to three classes. However, HSP students will NOT receive CCS report cards or transcripts showing Carnegie Units earned. HSP students will receive grade updates. HSP students must pass all classes enrolled. HSP students cannot take dual enrollment classes through CCS.

Admissions Criteria

HSP applicants must

- complete the interview process and entrance exam.
- have an overall 2.5 GPA on their most recent report card. If HSP does not have a traditional report card, you must present the curriculum and work samples.
- turn in standardized test scores. If a HSP student does not have any standardized test scores, the entrance exam will heavily affect the admission decision.
- have proof of a good behavior record.
- have three letters of recommendation.

Homeschool Student Procedures

ARRIVAL - HSP students must

1. arrive at the main office 10-15 minutes before class is scheduled to begin.
2. sign in at the main office.
 - a. If a HSP student has a 1st-period class, he/she can go to the Student Area **after** signing in with the front office.
 - b. If a HSP student does NOT have a 1st-period class, he/she must sign in at the front office, then sit quietly in the lobby and remain there until dismissed to go to class. Once dismissed, he/she must go directly to the class he/she is assigned to.

DISMISSAL - HSP students must

1. go directly to the main office when dismissed from the last enrolled class (1st - 6th period).
 - a. If HSP does NOT have a 7th-period class, he/she must be picked up by parents from the main office within 15 minutes after class is dismissed.
 - b. If HSP has a 7th-period class, he/she can go to the dismissal area for pickup.

Homeschool Student Policies

(Follows all CCS Policies)

ATTENDANCE

HSP students are required to follow the same attendance policy as full-time students. Attendance is imperative for students' success to learn and grow as independent leaders. HSP parents should communicate with the school concerning any absences.

DISCIPLINE PROCEDURES

HSP students enrolled at Courtney Christian School are required to follow all standards, policies, and procedures the same as all CCS students. Any infraction of a CCS discipline rule will be handled the same as any other student. CCS will not accommodate persistent behaviors of aggression and/or defiance. ACADEMICS

HSP students must enroll in at least one class in order to play sports. HSP students must pass all classes enrolled and will only receive interim reports for grades. NO report cards or transcripts will be issued.

TOPS ELIGIBILITY

HSP students are not eligible for TOPS through CCS; however, it is strongly suggested that parents contact TOPS to determine how their child can meet the criteria.

ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY

Courtney Christian High School is currently a part of the Northshore Independent Athletic League (NIAL) for grades 3 - 8 and Association of Christian Educators of Louisiana (ACEL) for grades 8 - 12.

NIAL allows HSP students to play sports for a private school if enrolled in at least ONE class.

ACEL allows Hybrid Educational Students to play sports for a private school. A Hybrid Educational Student is defined to mean that the student's education blends aspects of a Traditional Homeschool Student, a Traditional Private School, and/or a Private School at Home Student. Hybrid Educational Students may also participate in sports if at least THREE courses are taken at one time (or two courses for seniors) with the private school. HSP athletes must live within a 75-mile radius of their team's practice facility/field. All students must maintain a 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale. All students/athletes are required to take and pass a physical examination.

For the 2025-2026 school year, CCS will have several "unofficial" sport teams for high school students in which HSP students can play if enrolled in at least ONE class at CCS.

GRADUATION

Participation in the graduation ceremony is available only for full-time CCS students. HSP students will not receive a diploma from CCS.

CHAPEL

HSP students should participate in chapel if their school schedule is during the time of chapel.

UNIFORMS

HSP students must follow the same dress code policy as all other students.
